This week's Topic: In-Vitro Fertilization: Mourning for lost siblings



Education: Rebecca Taylor, of LifeNews.com, received an email from a reader who mourns the loss of her siblings.(1) Her two siblings were created, along with herself, through the process of in vitro fertilization (IVF), also referred to as Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART). All three were transferred to her mother's uterus, but only she survived. This young woman says "I mourn my siblings every single day. I can't talk about them with my parents ... they don't count my siblings as members of the family.... I'm the only one who seems to care about them." She goes on to

say, "It hurts me every time I see in the news something about IVF, because the media treats it as if it's okay. There's never any mention that people die during the process."

IVF does not restore normal function of the reproductive organs, but replaces the normal process of creating a child through an act of love with a different process, which treats children as a desired product to be manufactured, rather than a gift from God. Embryos are created under conditions in which the majority of embryos are unable to survive. (Data from the CDC indicate that roughly 15% of embryos transferred to a uterus in 2011 survived.(2) In addition to those who die in utero, other embryos are discarded, donated to research (to die), or are frozen indefinitely.)
