LIFE CHAIN is a peaceful and prayerful public witness, and a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian Community against abortion. It is a time for prayerful self-analysis, repentance, and serious commitment to helping end abortion in our nation. During the Life Chain time, idle chatter, frivolity, and both verbal and physical responses to motorists are strongly discouraged.

The easy-to-hold 18" x 22" Life Chain signs are backprinted to feature Prayer Topics, Songs of Meditation, and the Life Chain Code of Conduct. ("In the spirit of Christian love, commit to being peaceful, prayerful, and polite, in word and deed.") Churches are asked to coordinate the distribution of signs to their members.

While Life Chain is primarily organized through church participation, clubs, company groups, or individuals would be most welcome. Call or email the coordinators listed on the front, or just stop by at one of the intersections noted to pick up a sign (a limited number will be available there).

She went to Rte 6 in Sugar Land and parked. It was not yet 2:00 but there were already several people along the highway with signs. Another car pulled off the road and parked nearby. A Hispanic woman, perhaps in her 30's, was crying uncontrollably. "Would you pray with me?" "Of course!" Margaret replied.

As they prayed together, Margaret learned that seeing the signs had worked powerfully to bring back the memory of this woman's abortion. She had felt such an outpouring of love when she saw the people with their signs. It was the great love that brought her tears and allowed her to surrender to God, to open her heart to receive his mercy. She was able to express her remorse as she and Margaret prayed together for forgiveness and healing. We don't know how many years she had been keeping that memory buried, hidden deep in her heart. She was very probably ashamed to tell anyone, afraid of what they might think of her, knowing what she thought of herself for doing such a thing. Perhaps she still vacillated between justifying her actions and feeling a terrible guilt, or had pushed the traumatic event out of her conscious thoughts. The signs on the road did not make her feel judged or condemned, but through the grace of the Holy Spirit, enabled her to feel the immense love God has for her even with the fact of her abortion. She was quick to respond by pulling off the road, and indeed, she found a willing prayer partner to join her in asking for God's mercy and grace to be poured out on her. We thank God for bringing this woman down Highway 6 at just the right time that Sunday, with Margaret placed exactly where she needed to be, to pray with her and encourage her. We pray that she has found peace in the forgiveness of Christ, and healing from the wound of abortion.
