Protecting Children from Sexual Harm



Education: About one in ten children will be sexually abused by the time they reach 18. They are often too confused, scared or embarrassed to report it right away, so it often continues. The perpetrators are not usually strangers to the children, but someone they trusted.(1) Child abusers often use pornography to “groom” their victims. (2)

11% of boys and 8% of girls have seen pornography before they were 10 years old. 22% of children ages 9 -16 said their top online concern was being exposed to pornography. Pornography can disrupt normal childhood development and warp a child’s attitude toward sex. Chemicals are released in the brain that cause a desire for more, so ALL children are biologically wired to be interested and affected by nudity and sex. (3) Sexually active teens and young adults are at higher risk for acquiring sexually transmitted infections (STIs), due to a combination of behavioral, biological, and cultural factors. Though they make up 25% of the sexually active population, they account for nearly half of new STI cases. (4) The U. S. continues to have among the highest teen pregnancy, birth, and abortion rates in the developed world. (4)

So how can you protect your children from abuse, pornography, and early sex? There are several resources that can help parents to teach their children about private body parts, boundaries, pornography, and reasons to delay sexual activity.
