### Egg Donation - Risks and Morality

---



**Education:** In Vitro Fertilization to produce children for infertile couples is big business. Some women wanting babies are unable to produce healthy eggs, so eggs from young, healthy women are in demand. If the donors are intelligent and beautiful, or of Asian or Jewish ethnicity, the value of their eggs is even higher. So companies in the business of procuring eggs go to college campuses and third world countries, where the donor fee of thousands of dollars is likely to attract donors. Many young women feel that they are doing a wonderful thing to help another couple have a baby, and they can earn money at the same time. (1)

But there are serious risks involved in egg donation, and long term studies have not been done. Powerful drugs are used to manipulate the donor's ovaries to synchronize with the recipient and produce several eggs at once, rather than the usual one. Harvesting the eggs also poses risks. (1) A 2025 article described how Asian women were trafficked for use as surrogates, and to leave the program they had to sell their eggs to pay for their return expenses. But aside from the physical risks, what about the morality of egg donation? While women may be motivated by a charitable desire to help another woman have a child, do they realize that their eggs will be used to produce several children, most of whom will not survive? Do they realize that children they help create may be raised by homosexual parents or basically sold? Do they realize that NaPro Technology actually offers infertile couples better hope of success than IVF? Do they understand that a child has the right to know that they were a fruit of their parents' love for each other? Do they think about how a child will feel, knowing that they have an anonymous mother that they will never meet?
